10 Lessons Learned in over 40 Years of Leadership

Lindsay has been involved in leadership positions in IFES and the Lausanne Movement over the last 40 years. In this seminar he will share 10 lessons he has learned about leadership through observing other leaders and his own (few) successes and (many!) failures.

Lindsay Brown is a native of Wales. He studied European history at Oxford (MA) and theology at the Free Faculty of Theology at Vaux-sur-Seine, near Paris, under Henri Blocher. He has been involved in student ministry with IFES for over 40 years, serving variously as European Regional Secretary, International General Secretary and currently heads up FEUER (Fellowship of Evangelists in the Universities of Europe) a network formed by a joint effort of UCCF, the British student movement and IFES, the international evangelical student body - which has as its aspiration the renewal of public communication of the gospel in the universities of Europe. He recently served as the International Director for the Lausanne Movement for World Evangelization.

	1.	Be clear regarding your vision - beware the loss of focus

	4.	Keep up your reading - avoid the danger of dryness	

5.	Don't worry about numbers - beware the danger of jealousy towards those working with larger groups or in larger ministry
6.	Cultivate a bottomless capacity to handle disappointment - avoid the danger of bitterness
7.	Build for life and think long-term - avoid short term-ism
8.	Remember leadership is a team game - avoid the danger of isolation
9.	Remember there is a cost - have little care for status.
10	. Finish well - avoid the danger of discouragement
