Principles For Having a G.R.E.A.T. Day

G. GREET the day with PRAISE

Ps. 118:24 "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

"rejoice" = Hebrew: gil = shout out with joy "be glad" = Hebrew: samach = cheer "Today, I choose to resign as General Manager of the Universe. Lord, God Almighty, this is going to be a great day!"

e.g. Alphabetical Worship: "Thank you. Lord that you are A _____B ____C ____"

R. REPORT to the day with **PURPOSE**

Acts 13:36 "For David, after he had served the purpose of God in his own generation, fell asleep, and was laid among his fathers..."

Rehearsing My Daily Purpose

#1. "I am a Child of God." "Today, I will not lose focus on who I am" Jn. 1:12-13; 2 Cor. 5:17; Col. 3:1-5

#2. "I am a Soldier of the Cross." "Today, I will not let myself get distracted from my duty to my Commander." cf. 2 Tim. 2:3-4

#3. "I am a Servant of God." "Today, I will obey my Master at all costs." Deut. 11:26-28; Josh. 24:15

#4. "I am an Ambassador of Jesus Christ. "Today, I will represent My King in everything I say and do." 2 Cor. 5:20 ; Eph. 6:18-20

E. ENGAGE the day with a PLAN cf. James 4:13 -15

Prov. 16:1-3 "The plans of the heart belong to man, but the answer of the tongue is from the Lord. All the ways of a man are clean in his own sight, but the Lord weighs the motives. Commit your works to the Lord, and your plans will be established."

A. ANALYZE the day with PERSPECTIVE

Luke 5:26 "And they were all seized with astonishment and began glorifying God; and they were filled with fear (i.e. reverence), saying, 'We have seen remarkable things today.'"

Question #2. In what ways was today successful?

Question #3. In what areas would God say I did poorly today? Heb. 3:15 ; 2 Sa. 3:39; 1 Sa. 14:38

Question #4. What would He have me do better tomorrow? Matt. 6:34; 2 Chr. 20:16-17

T. TERMINATE the day with PRAYER

1 Kings 18:36 "Then it came about at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near and said, 'O Lord, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, today let it be known that Thou art God in Israel, and that I am Thy servant, and that I have done all these things at Thy word." cf. Neh. 1:11

Concluding Challenge: Carpe Diem = Seize the Day
