Lessons Learned as a Businessman, Politician, and Philanthropist

Lord Edmiston has experience as a successful businessman, who has at times employed more than 1000 people, as a former member of the British House of Lords who has listened to many political debates and has a continuing interest in politics, and as a philanthropist who is donating significant funds to a Christian ministry he has established with operations in 27 countries. Out of this experience and passion, he will share some of the lessons he has learned.

He is married to Tracie and together in 1988 they founded CV, an international charity with offices in 22 countries working to support the Christian church in the areas of evangelism and discipleship in both the online and offline space. Lord and Lady Edmiston also sponsor three senior schools. Lord Edmiston, having been a member of the House of Lords, retired in July 2015 to devote more time to his charitable activities.
