An Introduction to Biblical Preaching

Before we start to think about how to prepare a message to preach, we have to be clear what we mean by preaching. In this session, Andy will introduce us to the foundational biblical and theological building blocks of a preaching and Bible teaching ministry. Once we are all on the same page, then we can launch into the process!
