Why Preach the Prophets?

The Old Testament prophets played a critical role in revealing God's plan of salvation. They occupy a significant portion of the Biblical canon similar in size to the entire New Testament. Despite this prominent position they are often ignored in most pulpits. We will explore the theological richness of the prophets and consider the importance of their message for the Church.
