How to Use Environmental Topics to Explain the Gospel in Today's Language

Topics related to "the Environment" have dominated public discussion and policy-making for decades. While the sub-topics have been changing, ranging from the ozone hole, radioactive waste, global cooling (1970s) to global warming, the subtext has remained the same: Does life on this planet have a future? In this workshop, we will see that the Bible has a lot to say about the environment. The anxiety many people feel about the environment needs to be taken seriously and addressed with the agenda God has given for the here and now, and with the hope God has provided for the future.

 - 1. Christians without passion for creation and Creator
 - 2. Christians that exploit humanity's unique position rather than understand we are stewards of creation

- 1. Christians have a reason why creation should be preserved: because it was created "good".
- 2. Christians believe that God wants to heal and preserve life.
- 3. Christians believe in human salvation.
