

Life Lesson 1: My Identity is in Christ



In Christ I am: Loved Forgiven Redeemed Accepted Adopted Secure

My identity is NOT in lesser things: status, title, job, possessions, relationships, reputation, wealth, appearance, education, accomplishments, etc

Because my identity is in Christ-

• I can stand firm under trials

"I will show you what it's like when someone comes to me, <mark>listens</mark> to my teaching, and then follows it. Because my identity is in Christ-

• No amount of BAD news can change the GOOD NEWS!

 - Unfair or inaccurate stereotypes/labels
 - Under constant attack



- Pitfalls
 - Being unfamiliar with the enemy and his tactics
 - Not knowing my vulnerabilities
 - Not suiting up for battle
 - Forgetting who wins



- We engage with optimism because God has given us the mandate to exercise His authority
 - Genesis 1 "Rule with Him and for Him"
 - "In the total expanse of human life there is not a single square inch of which Christ, who alone is sovereign, does not declare "That is mine!"

- We engage with optimism because God's character demands that we pursue justice
 - "Hate evil, love good; maintain justice in the courts." Amos 5:15
 - Micah 6:8 He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

- We engage with optimism because of Christ's example
 - Matthew 23:23 "you have neglected the more important matters of the law-justice, mercy and faithfulness"
 - Luke 18- The Parable of the Persistent Widow who cries out for justice


- Pitfalls
 - A false optimism- seeing things through "rose coloured spectacles"
 - Not seeing challenges clearly
 - Not preparing adequately


- They should ...

• Pitfall- Meddling

"Like one who grabs a stray dog by the ears is someone who <mark>rushes into a quarrel not their own</mark>." Proverbs 26:17

• Pitfall- Lack of boundaries

Well intentioned people are always trying to get you to buy in to their cause, so make sure you have good boundaries in place to guard your core mission.

• Pitfalls- Distractions/interruptions

"But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"


- Pitfalls- Perfectionism/comparisons
 - Perfectionism- impossible, exhausts and alienates
 - Comparisons- divide, dishearten and disappoint

- We must work with integrity and faith


- We live in a fallen world. We live in the "City of Man."

- But we can seek to advance God's Kingdom by building relationships and showing care to those in authority over us.

• Pitfalls

- A flawed definition of success
- Thinking everything depends on me
- A failure to rely on God

Principle 4: Respect

• All people as image bearers of Christ-

• "God created human beings in his own image" Gen 1:27

• Fellow believers-

• "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves." Romans 12:10

• Non-believers-

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander. 1 Peter 3:15-16

Principle 4: Respect

Principle 4: Respect

- Pitfalls
 - Takes great effort- everything we do and say to others makes a statement about our regard for them
 - Takes significant practice and self restraint- especially when personally attacked or deliberately misrepresented

"it is the kindness of God that leads to repentance"



Principle 4: Respect

- Falling down and getting up


"We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."

Conflict-

• Occurs when you are making a difference-

"Dogs don't bark at parked cars- if you are moving, you will be criticized."

• Occurs when you confront evil-

"All who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted." 2 Timothy 3:12

"We knowingly enter into and initiate conflict with evil whenever we proclaim the gospel, preach holiness, protest against sin in our society, teach against cults or testify to Christ in the midst of a world that does not want to change."

• Often comes in obedience to Christ-

"Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side...the boat was ..<mark>buffeted</mark> by waves because the wind was against it. ...During the night...Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. When the disciples saw him.., they were terrified."

Matt 14:22, 24-26

- Pitfall
 - Valuing comfort over obedience by-
 - Avoiding
 - Compromising
 - Forcing redemption rather than offering it freely





 - Daniel's example
- Effective relationships are built on authenticity

- Pitfalls
 - Compromising the truth
 - Passion leading to harshness
 - The temptation to dilute the message to fit in

Principle 8: Courage

- When called to serve in the public square, courage is often demonstrated through challenges-
 - Being the minority that reveres God (Noah preached to an unresponsive world- Heb 11:7)
 - Hearing clearly but without clarity (Abraham went, though he didn't know where he was going- Heb 11:8)
 - Believing the impossible (Sarah bore children when past age- Heb 11:11)
 - Trusting God's timing and God's ways (His ways are higher-Isaiah 55:8-10)

Principle 8: Courage

- Pitfalls
 - Being so mired in the culture that I have lost sight of the cross
 - "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Cor 12:9
 - Not taking God at His Word

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Principle 9: Courage

"Bind up the brokenhearted.' 'Correct oppression.' 'Bring justice to the fatherless.' 'Speak the truth in love.' By mounting a defense against the Reproductive Health Equity Act, my colleagues and I were merely trying to be obedient to the Lord's commands. Through the use of our legislative tools, we sought to love God and love people.... I hope our story will inspire others to fight the good fight of faith even in the face of overwhelming opposition."


Principle 8: Courage

Principle 9: Context


• Pitfalls

Principle 9: CONTEXT

KNOWING YOUR AUDIENCE (CONTEXT) INCREASES THE LIKELIHOOD OF ACCOMPLISHING YOUR GOAL
