What are the Characteristics of a Pioneer?

Paul's planting of the church in Thessalonica give us a unique picture of the life of a pioneer, as well as the first step in church planting. As a pioneer, method and program does not come first, but life and character, nor is it an I, but a WE. Going through chapter 2 in Paul's first letter to the church in Thessalonica, we will clarify the most important issues in a church planter's life.

Paul's church planting was characterised by: Leadership/Leaders that **gave themselves** to imperfect people. By the example of their own life in **passion**, **purity**, **purpose**, **persistent and power**, they were bound to the people and transferring their own life with Christ to the new converts, leading them to the cross and helping make them productive through their **obedience to the Word**, and their walk in the **Holy Spirit**.
