3) Alarm #3 God is calling you to pray regarding your marital future.

1 Cor. 7:1-2; 1 Thess. 4:3-5; 1 Cor. 7:7-8; 1 Cor. 7:25-40

4) Alarm #4 God is calling you to learn self-control.

1 Cor. 7:9; Gal. 5:22-13; Ps. 37:3-7; Is. 40:27-31

5) Alarm #5 God is calling you to immediate Christian service.

1 Cor. 7:32-35

6) Alarm #6 God is calling you to learn how to build intimate relationships.

Level 2: The Loving Friend (Hebrew: ahab) Prov. 18:24

Level 3: The Trusted Companion (Hebrew: chaber) Mal. 2:14
