The Apostle Paul is in prison for the second time in the city of Rome, writing to Timothy in the Church of Ephesus a few months he is executed in 67 A.D.

From 2 Timothy 1:3-7 we learn that the Effective Servant-Leader...

1. Thanks God for fellow Christian workers.

2 Timothy 1:3a "I thank God..."

2. Serves God in the purity of a God-centered life.

2 Timothy 1:3b "...whom I serve with a clear conscience the way my forefathers did..."

3. Communicates with God continually.

2 Timothy 1:3c "...as I constantly remember you in my prayers night and day..."

4.	Longs to	fellowship	with	God's	people.

2 Timothy 1:4a "...longing to see you even as I recall your tears...

5. Acknowledges His need for other Christians.

2 Timothy 1:4b "...so that I may be filled with joy."

6. Expresses confidence in the faith of other believers.

2 Timothy 1:5 "For I am mindful of the sincere faith within you..."

7. Exhorts and encourages fellow Christians.

2 Timothy 1:6 "I remind you to kindle afresh the gift of God which is in you..."

8. Relies on God for boldness in ministry.

2 Timothy 1:7a "For God has not given us a spirit of timidity but of power..."

9. Relies on God for an ability to love those he ministers to.

2 Timothy 1:7b "...and love..."

10. Relies on God for self-control.

2 Timothy 1:7c "...and discipline."
