
How Does Good Theology Lead to Good Society, Law and Politics?

Modern society tends to be presented with two assumed opposites with regard to the relationship between Christianity and society. On the one hand it is assumed that society should be secular and that religion should be at the level of a private club. The alternative to this is assumed to be a kind of Christian theocracy where the church runs the State and pastors have as much political power as politicians. There is another, more biblical way. This seminar will look at how what we believe affects the way we behave and changes society for the better. We will look at how theology impacts society, law and politics. The 'salt and light' model of Jesus Christ is one that is more desperately needed in contemporary society than ever. Come and be prepared to think, engage, change, and be challenged.

David Robertson is the minister of St Peter's Free Church in Dundee, Scotland (a church that is best known for being the church of Robert Murray McCheyne) and the Director of the Solas Centre for Public Christianity. He is the author of *Awakening* (a contemporary account of McCheyne's life), *The Dawkins Letters, Magnificent Obsession* and *Quench*.
