The Jesus Model: Going Deeper

Returning to the Jesus Model that was covered in the Foundational Track, the speakers will review the basic principles, and then take them deeper into focused application. Since Jesus is the best model for ministry that exists, a close look at His life gives us the best guidance for a wide range of ministry environments and cultures.

Christ modeled the process of making a disciple, as well as the process of building a disciple making ministry.

A. The process of making a disciple

Christ met people where they were at and challenged them to take the next step forward spiritually. In his life we see five basic types of challenges.

B. The product of building a disciple making ministry

As we look at the events of Christ's life we observe that the focus of his ministry changed over time. It is possible to view his ministry in five distinct phases, each which have different priorities.
