Spiritual Warfare

Spiritual warfare: after more than 30 years of popularity and controversy in evangelical Christian circles, how might we outline a general biblical framework for spiritual warfare? In this workshop, I will look at Ephesians as a primer in spiritual warfare based on evidence both in the epistle and from the account of the Ephesians from Acts chapter 19. I will explore ways that this can be used as a viable biblical model for engaging in spiritual warfare ministry among believers based on Paul's approach to the Ephesians as seen in his epistle to them.

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Thesis: Paul wrote this epistle to a people whose city was steeped in magic and powers as a foundation to meet their needs as they continued to face spiritual warfare after coming to Christ.
