Under his leadership the denomination is striving to plant 100 new churches in Germany in ten years. After seven years 65 churches have been planted. He has himself planted five churches in Germany and has written and lectured on what it would take to see a church planting multiplication movement to take root in Germany and in Europe. He is the author of *The Jesus Model: Planting Churches like Jesus*. Dietrich has been married to Jan Carla for thirty-two years, and they have three adult children.
