

Grappling with Inequality: Nehemiah 5:1-19

In this talk on Nehemiah 5, we look at how Nehemiah led in response to inequality and exploitation.

Ajith Fernando serves as Teaching Director of Youth for Christ in Sri Lanka after being National Director for 35 years. His main responsibilities are mentoring leaders and teaching staff and volunteers. He ministers to Christian workers and others through a counselling and a Bible teaching ministry in Sri Lanka and abroad. He has written 15 books and his books have been published in 19 different languages. *The Call to Joy and Pain* was awarded the Christianity Today Book of the Year Award for church and pastoral leadership.
