# Leading a Local Church

Local church pastors have enormous demands on them. Everyone expects pastors to solve their problems, to look perfectly, and to always be available. How do you lead effectively in this environment? How do you adapt your leadership as the church experiences change and growth? This workshop will consider the role of the local church pastor and share some insights on bringing vision, strategy and structure to the life of the church while also developing relationships with people in and around the church.

**John Stevens** is the National Director of the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches, a family of over 500 Bible-centred churches in the UK, a position that he has held since 2010. Prior to this he was one of the founding pastors of City Evangelical Church Birmingham, which was planted in the centre of the UK's 2<sup>nd</sup> largest city in 1999. He was instrumental in starting the Midlands Gospel Partnership, was the course Director of the Midlands Ministry Training Course and is a visiting lecturer at Oak Hill Theological College. John is also one of the pastors of Christchurch Market Harborough, a church he helped to plant when he took up his current role. He was converted whilst studying law at Cambridge University, and after taking a post-graduate degree at the University of Oxford worked for 16 years as a University Lecture, ending his career as Deputy Head of the Law School at the University of Birmingham. #### 2. The Responsibilities of the Local Church Leader

a. Tasks of the Shepherd (Ezekiel 34v1-6; John 21v15-23; 1 Peter 5v1-4)

Lead the sheep

Feed the sheep

Protect the sheep

b. Trusting the Chief Shepherd

Jesus is the "Good Shepherd" of the sheep (John 10v11-18; 1 Peter 5v4) You are an under-shepherd (1 Peter 5v1-4) Jesus is the Head of the Church (Ephesians 5v22-24)

#### 3. Models of Local Church Leadership

- a. The Chaplain He meets the needs and demands of the congregation
- b. The Champion He does the work of ministry on behalf of the congregation
- c. The Coach He mentors the congregation to do the work of gospel
