## **Intercultural Teams: Experiences, Values, and Challenges**

We will hear from experienced leaders about their work on intercultural teams. What lessons can we learn to lead intercultural teams more effectively? What are the pitfalls we should avoid? How do we ovecome the challenges to more fully experience and foster the unity, fellowship, and maturity of the international body of Christ?

Anne Lise Søvde is the National Director of NORME (Norwegian council of Mission and Evangelisation), which is the merged Norwegian branch of The Lausanne Movement, the Evangelical Alliance in Norway, and the Norwegian Mission Council. She has been teaching in the Norwegian Outreach Center GUS (School of Mission) and the Centro Superior de Teologia de Asambleas de Dios (CESTAD) in Spain. She has also been working in the missions department in the Pentecostal Church of Norway and earned a master's degree in theology at the Norwegian Lutheran Faculty (MF) in 2008.

**Scott Moreau** served ten years with Cru Africa, teaching science at Ntonjeni Swazi National High School (1978-1980) and missions at the Nairobi International School of Theology (NIST; 1984-1991). In 1991, he joined the Intercultural Studies department at Wheaton College, where he is Professor of Intercultural Studies and Missions as well as Associate Dean of Wheaton College Graduate School. He edits *Evangelical Missions Quarterly* and the *Encountering Mission* series (Baker), and serves on several agency and other boards. He has written or edited 20 books and over 300 articles in mission-related journals, magazines, and dictionaries. His most recent book, *Effective Intercultural Communication: A Christian Perspective*, was published by Baker in 2014.

**Yulia Nikolaychuk** has been the general secretary of CCX-Ukraine - a member of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES) – since 2015. Yulia's experience with CCX goes back as far as 2007, from being a student leader, then growing into a student staffworker in the Crimea and regional coordinator in Kyiv. She strongly believes that students are the driving force of the country and maintains CCX's idea to bring a more intellectual Gospel to the universities. In 2014-2015, Yulia took part in establishing and leading the NGO Stop Bribing: I Don't Give and Don't Take Bribes. Her church involvement includes ministering to orphans and youth. Yulia holds a master's degree in physics and mathematics and she has taught informatics, math, and astronomy at a Christian school.

**Siri Telstø Skeie** is a programme facilitator for IFES's exchange program at Hald Internasjonale Senter. Hald is a school in cross-cultural communication and international work and has 70 young students from 10 different countries. All students are divided into teams and sent for a 6.5-month internship all over the world. Apart from leading classes in teambuilding, leadership, and personal growth, she also serves as a counsellor and facilitator for the internship. Siri has worked in the children and youth department in Normisjon for many years. She is involved in a young and growing local church in the Mission Covenant Church of Norway, and she is part of the leadership team of Liv i ledelse – an Arrow-based leadership program run by NORME. Siri did her studies in cross-cultural communication, development, christianity, and the norwegian language.
