**Daryl McCarthy** serves as Vice President of Academic Programs and Strategy with Forum of Christian Leaders (FOCL). He is also Director of the European Leadership Forum Academic Leaders Network which provides networking, training, and mentoring for evangelicals in higher education. Daryl has traveled to more than 55 nations and has spoken at universities, conferences, and churches around the world. In 1988 he helped found Global Scholars (formerly International Institute for Christian Studies) and served as President until 2014. Daryl earned a Doctor of Ministry from Fuller Theological Seminary School of Intercultural Studies, Master of Divinity from Nazarene Theological Seminary, Master of Arts in Philosophy of Religion from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and a Bachelor of Theology from Kansas City College and Bible School. Daryl and his wife Dr. Teri McCarthy lived in Lithuania 2010-2015 where they taught at Lithuania University of Educational Sciences Department of English Philology in Vilnius. They have one son and one daughter who are both married and they have four grandchildren.

**Yury Bachyshcha** studied at the Belarusian State Pedagogic University (Minsk), and did his PhD in History there. He taught history in universities in Minsk, and since 2007 he has been teaching at the European Humanities University in Vilnius (Lithuania). He became a follower of Christ in 2002 and joined the New Reformation Movement in Belarus. He is the coordinator of the Institute of New Reformation and University Network at the East European Leadership Forum. He also helps as a speaker at the worldview debate club in Minsk. Her interest in studying the effects of media use and digital technologies on everyday life led her into new learning contexts like formation in psychotherapy, management of public policies and a new Ph.D. in multimedia in performing arts.
