A few years ago he helped to grow and lead a start-up Anglican Church in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he was asked by Archbishop Bob Duncan to raise a small team and offer evangelism training in the emerging Anglican Province in North America. Michael's previous experiences include being Principal of St John's College, Nottingham; Rector of St Aldate's Church, Oxford; Professor of Evangelism at Regent College, Vancouver; and Advisor to the Archbishops of Canterbury and York on Evangelism. He has written numerous books including But Don't All Religions Lead to God; I believe in the Holy Spirit; Jesus for Skeptics, which is being widely used in missions and has been translated into several languages, and When God Breaks In, a study of revivals in dark times, culminating most notably in modern China. Michael and his wife Rosemary live in Oxford, England.
