Fifty Years of Marriage and Ministry: Life Lessons and Passions

Marriage and ministry came concurrently for the Streeters in 1964 when Tom was ordained, accepted a church position and then married Judy. Side by side through the years in several different churches, the Streeters have seen their calling as a high privilege as they have worked together as a team. Marriage and family have been an integral aspect of their ministry, interwoven with the body life of the church. Life lessons have become passions in areas of meaningful relationships, worship, disciplemaking, the life of the mind, the beauty of God's created order, consistent study, reading, and authentic living. In this workshop, the Streeters will summarize the important lessons they have learned and the passions that guide and motivate them.

Judy Streeter and her husband Tom have worked to develop churches that emphasise worship, community, small groups, sound teaching, discipleship, and meaningful engagement with culture. Believing that evangelism and the strength of the church are only as effective as the disciple-making process, she has developed materials to facilitate women in properly nurturing growth in others. Her book, *Disciplemaking: Doing What Christ Commanded*, summarises her understanding and passion in this area. Music occupies a high place in Judy's life in the church and as a teacher and performer. Always ready to travel, she and Tom have led Reformation tours in Europe.

Tom Streeter served for 33 years as the teaching elder of the church he planted in Zionsville, Indiana, and now serves as the fulltime director of *The Institute for Christian Thought*, an organization he founded in 1997 with the aim of calling followers of Christ to a full-orbed life of thinking and living Christianly. With over 50 years experience in pastoral ministry, and having planted churches in Illinois and Indiana, his work has been characterized by a devotion to worship, community, developing disciples within the context of the local church and a focus upon believers discerningly engaging the world in their various callings. His lifelong studies in theology, the church, and history have included tours focused upon the Reformation in Europe and the First Great Awakening in upper New England.
