BAAL AND ASHERAH

- Chapter 3 -

"And the king stood by the pillar and made a covenant before the LORD, to walk after the LORD and to keep his commandments and his testimonies and his statutes with all his heart and all his soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. And all the people joined in the covenant." 2 Kings 23:3

After Josiah found the book of the law in the temple and read it to the people, he led the most thorough cleansing of the land since the days of David. He even removed idols that had been in place continuously for over 300 years—since King Solomon.

There are thousands of false gods in the world. Godchecker.com lists over 4000 specific deities, and Hinduism alone claims to worship 33 million gods.

Yet there are just 7 types of idols removed when Josiah thoroughly cleanses the land. It may be that these are archetypes, representing the main kinds of idols man naturally creates.

ASHERAH — GODDESS OF FERTILITY

⁵The king ordered Hilkiah the high priest, the priests next in rank and the doorkeepers to remove from the temple of the Lord all the articles made for Baal and **Asherah**... He burned them outside Jerusalem in the fields of the Kidron Valley and took the ashes to Bethel. ⁶He took the **Asherah pole** from the temple of the Lord to the Kidron Valley outside Jerusalem and burned it there. He ground it to powder and scattered the dust over the graves of the common people. ⁷He also tore down the quarters of the male shrine prostitutes that were in the temple of the Lord, the quarters where women did weaving for **Asherah**.

⁸Josiah brought all the priests from the towns of Judah and desecrated the high places, from Geba to Beersheba, where the priests had burned incense. He broke down the gateway at the entrance of the Gate of Joshua, the city governor, which was on the left of the city gate. ⁹ Although the priests of the high places did not serve at the altar of the Lord in Jerusalem, they ate unleavened bread with their fellow priests.

¹⁴Josiah smashed the sacred stones and cut down the **Asherah poles** and covered the sites with human bones.

¹⁵Even the altar at Bethel, the high place made by Jeroboam son of Nebat, who had caused Israel to sin—even that altar and high place he demolished. He burned the high place and ground it to powder, and burned the **Asherah pole** also. ¹⁶Then Josiah looked around, and when he saw the tombs that were there on the hillside, he had the bones removed from them and burned on the altar to defile it, in accordance with the word of the Lord proclaimed by the man of God who foretold these things. 2 Kings 23

- Borrowed from Assyria. The wife of the war god Asir, the national god of Assyria
- Goddess of fertility
- Helped women bear children
- The tree trunk or stone that symbolized Asherah was regarded as a bet-el—a house of deity. They were placed on high places under spreading trees.
- 2 Kings 21:7 Manasseh took and carved an Asherah pole and erected it in the temple






- Both Ur and Haran, where Abraham and Sarah came from, were centers of moon and sun worship
- Became a problem during the Assyrian dominance.
- Horses and chariots dedicated to the sun
- Chariots were used by the sun-god to traverse the heavens











"On the venerable day of the Sun let the magistrates and people residing in cities rest, and let all workshops be closed. In the country however, persons engaged in agriculture may freely and lawfully continue their pursuits because it often happens that another day is not suitable for grain-sowing or vine planting; lest by neglecting the proper moment for such operations the bounty of heaven should be lost."

¹⁰And he defiled Topheth, which is in the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, that no one might burn his son or his daughter as an offering to **Molech**.

¹³And the king defiled the high places that were east of Jerusalem, to the south of the mount of corruption, which Solomon the king of Israel had built for... **Milcom** the abomination of the Ammonites. 2 Kings 23

WHERE WAS WORSHIP TO MOLECH LOCATED?

- In the Valley of Hinnom to the south and west of Jerusalem Jeremiah 32:35
- On the Mount of Olives I Kings 11:7
- In ravines and under overhanging crags Isaiah 57:5

WHAT IS MOLECH LIKE?

- Ammonite god (a nation east of the Jordan river)
 Jeremiah 49:1,3
- Name sounds very close to Hebrew "melek" which means king (2518 occurrences in OT)
- Man with the head of a bull

- Solomon built a shrine for him in Jerusalem on the Mount of Olives — I Kings 11:5,7,33
- Worship involved throwing children into a furnace or fire as part of a ceremony. Not known if they were killed or made insensitive beforehand. Leviticus 18:21, 20:2-5, 2 Kings 21:6, Jeremiah 32:35



- Rabbinic writers described a bronze statue, human in form but with an ox's head, hollow within, and heated from below. Children were placed inside this structure and immolated while drums drowned out their cries.
- In modern English usage, "Moloch" can refer derivatively to any person or thing which demands or requires costly sacrifices.
- A rabbinical tradition attributed to the Yalkout of Rabbi Simeon says that the idol was hollow and was divided into seven compartments; in one of which they put flour, in the second turtle-doves, in the third a ewe, in the fourth a ram, in the fifth a calf, in the sixth an ox, and in the seventh a child—which were all burned together by heating the statue inside.

To spin around, under the influence of any violent emotion

Psalms 32:11 Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you righteous; And shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

Psalms 35:9 And my soul shall be joyful in the Lord; It shall rejoice in his salvation.

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Psalms 118:24 This is the day the Lord has made; We will rejoice and be glad in it.

HALLAL

To praise, to make a show or rave about, to glory in or boast upon, to be clamorously foolish about your adoration of God

Psalms 22:23 You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you descendants of Jacob, glorify him, and fear him, all you offspring of Israel!

Psalms 44:8 In God we boast all day long, and praise your name forever. Selah

Psalms 63:5 My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness, and my mouth shall praise you with joyful lips.

RANAN

To emit a strident sound, to shout aloud for joy

Psalms 7:17 I will praise the Lord according to his righteousness, and will sing praise to the name of the Lord Most High.

Psalms 33:1 Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! For praise from the upright is beautiful.

Psalms 98:4 Shout joyfully to the Lord, all the earth; Break forth in song, rejoice, and sing praises.

SHACHAH

To depress or prostrate in homage or loyalty to God, bow down, fall down flat

Psalms 29:2 Give unto the Lord the glory due to his name; Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

Psalms 66:4 All the earth shall worship you and sing praises to You; They shall sing praises to your name. Selah

Psalms 95:6 Oh come, let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the Lord our maker.

SHUWR

Strolling minstrelsy, to sing, singer (man or woman)

Psalms 18:49 Therefore I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name.

Psalms 33:3 Sing to him a new song; Play skillfully with a shout of joy.

Psalms 144:9 I will sing a new song to you, O God; On a harp of ten strings I will sing praises to you.

TEHILLAH

To sing hallal, a new song, a hymn of spontaneous praise glorifying God in song

Psalms 34:1 I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth.

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Psalms 40:3 He has put a new song in my mouth—praise to our God. Many will see it and fear, and will trust in the Lord.

Psalms 149:1 Praise the Lord! Sing to the Lord a new song, and his praise in the assembly of saints.

TODAH

An extension of the hand, avowal, adoration, a choir of worshipers, confession, sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving

Psalms 50:14 Offer to God thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High.

Psalms 69:30 I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving.

Psalms 100:4 Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise. Be thankful to him, and bless his name.

YADAH

To use, hold out the hand, to throw (a stone or arrow) at or away, to revere or worship (with extended hands, praise thankful, thanksgiving)

Psalms 33:2 Praise the Lord with the harp; Make melody to him with an instrument of ten strings.

Psalms 61:8 So I will sing praise to your name forever, that I may daily perform my vows.

Psalms 18:49 Therefore I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name.

ZAMAR

To touch the strings or parts of a musical instrument i.e. play upon it, to make music accompanied by the voice, to celebrate in song and music, give praise, sing forth praises, psalms

Psalms 66:2 Sing out the honor of his name; Make his praise glorious.

Psalms 71:22 Also with the lute I will praise you—and your faithfulness, O my God! To you I will sing with the harp, O Holy One of Israel.

Psalms 144:9 I will sing a new song to you, O God; On a harp of ten strings I will sing praises to you.

ALATS

To jump for joy, exult, be joyful, rejoice, triumph

Psalms 5:11 But let all those rejoice who put their trust in you; Let them ever shout for joy, because you defend them; Let those also who love your name be joyful in you.

Psalms 9:2 I will be glad and rejoice in you; I will sing praise to your name, O Most High.

Psalms 68:3 But let the righteous be glad; Let them rejoice before God; Yes, let them rejoice exceedingly.

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ALAZ

To jump for joy, exult, be joyful, rejoice, triumph

Psalms 28:7 The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped; Therefore my heart greatly rejoices, and with my song I will praise him.

Psalms 68:4 Sing to God, sing praises to his name, extol him who rides on the clouds, by his name YAH (in NIV it says...his name is the LORD"), and rejoice before him.

Psalms 98:4 Shout joyfully to the Lord, all the earth; Break forth in song, rejoice, and sing praises.

ANAH

To eye or to heed, pay attention, to respond, to begin to speak, to sing, shout, testify, announce, give, account, afflict

Psalms 147:7 Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; Sing praises on the harp to our God.

CALAL

To mound up, exalt, reflex, to oppose, cast up, exalt (self), extol, make plain, raise up

Psalms 68:4 Sing to God, sing praises to his name; extol him who rides on the clouds, by His name YAH (same thing here...is it the LORD or YAHWEH?), and rejoice before him.

CAPHAR

To score with a mark, to inscribe, to enumerate, recount, celebrate, show forth, speak, talk, tell

Psalms 9:14 That I may tell of all your praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion. I will rejoice in your salvation.

Psalms 79:13 So we, your people and sheep of your pasture, will give you thanks forever; We will show forth your praise to all generations.

Isaiah 43:21 This people I have formed for myself; they shall declare my praise.

CHAGAG

To move in a circle, to march in a sacred procession, to observe a festival, to be giddy, celebrate, dance, to keep or hold a solemn feast (holiday), to reel to and fro

Leviticus 23:39 On the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the produce of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the LORD seven days.

CHUWL

To twist or whirl in a circular spiral manner, to dance

Judges 21:23 And the children of Benjamin did so; they took enough wives for their number from those who danced, whom they caught. Then they went and returned to their inheritance, and they rebuilt the cities and dwelt in them.

DAGAL

To flaunt, to raise a flag, to be conspicuous, set up with banners

Psalms 20:5 We will rejoice in your salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners! May the Lord fulfill all your petitions.

GADAL

To cause to be large, increase in estate, honor or pride, advance, boast, bring up, exceed, excellent, lift up, magnify, promote, speak proudly of

Psalms 34:3 Oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together.

Psalms 69:30 I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving.

Psalms 70:4 Let all those who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; And let those who love your salvation say continually, "Let God be magnified!"

GIYL

A revolution (of time and age), exceeding joy, gladness, greatly, rejoice

Psalm 32:11 Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you righteous; And shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

Psalm 65:12 They drop on the pastures of the wilderness, and the little hills rejoice on every side.

GOL

To call aloud, a voice or sound, bleating, crackling, cry, fame, lightness, lowing, noise, proclaiming, sing, sound, thunder, voice, yell

Psalms 95:1 Oh come, let us sing to the Lord! Let us shout joyfully to the rock of our salvation.

Psalms 95:2 Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving; let us shout joyfully to him with psalms.

Psalms 98:4 Shout joyfully to the Lord, all the earth; break forth in song, rejoice, and sing praises.

HILLUWL

A sense of rejoicing, a celebration of thanksgiving for harvest, merry, praise

Leviticus 19:24 But in the fourth year all its fruit shall be holy, a praise to the Lord.

KABED

Numerous, rich, honorable, to make weighty

Psalms 22:23 You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you descendants of Jacob, glorify him, and fear him, all you offspring of Israel!

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Psalms 86:9 All nations whom you have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord, and shall glorify your name.

Psalms 86:12 I will praise you, O Lord my God, with all my heart, and I will glorify your name forevermore.

KABOD

Splendor, copiousness, glorious, glory, honorable

Psalms 29:1 Give unto the Lord, O you mighty ones, Give unto the Lord glory and strength.

Psalms 66:2 Sing out the honor of his name; make his praise glorious.

Psalms 96:8 Give to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts.

KARA

To bend the knee, to sink, to prostrate, bow down self, bring down low

Psalms 22:29 All the prosperous of the earth shall eat and worship; all those who go down to the dust shall bow before him, even he who cannot keep himself alive.

Psalms 95:6 Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord our maker.

KARAR

To dance, whirl

2 Samuel 6:14 Then David danced before the Lord with all his might; and David was wearing a linen ephod.

MACHA

To rub or strike the hands together (in exultation), clap

Psalms 98:8 Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills be joyful together before the Lord...

MACHOWL

A round dance, dancing

Psalms 30:11 You have turned for me my mourning into dancing; you have put off my sackcloth and clothed me with gladness...

Psalms 149:3 Let them praise his name with the dance; let them sing praises to him with the timbrel and harp.

Jeremiah 31:13 Then shall the virgin rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old, together; for I will turn their mourning to joy, will comfort them, and make them rejoice rather than sorrow.

MANGIYNAH

A satire, music

Lamentations 3:63 Look at their sitting down and their rising up; I am their taunting song.

MASSA

A burden, an utterance, chiefly a doom, especially singing, prophecy, song, tribute

Habakkuk 1:1 The burden which the prophet Habakkuk saw.

Habakkuk 3:19 The Lord God is my strength; He will make my feet like deer's feet, and he will make me walk on my high hills. To the Chief Musician. With my stringed instruments.

MECHOWLAH

A dance company, dances

Exodus 15:20 Then Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took the timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and with dances.

Jeremiah 31:4 Again I will build you, and you shall be rebuilt, O virgin of Israel! You shall again be adorned with your tambourines, and shall go forth in the dances of those who rejoice.

MIZMOWR

Instrumental music, a poem set to notes, the word most frequently used for titles of the Psalms

Psalms 3:1 A Psalm of David when he fled from Absalom his son.

Psalms 13:1 To the Chief Musician. A Psalm of David.

Psalms 15:1 A Psalm of David.

NACAH

To lift, exalt, extol, hold, up, honor, magnify, regard, respect, yield

Psalms 28:2 Hear the voice of my supplications when I cry to you, when I lift up my hands toward your holy sanctuary.

Psalms 63:4 Thus I will bless you while I live; I will lift up my hands in your name.

Psalms 134:2 Lift up your hands in the sanctuary, and bless the Lord.

NAGAN

To thrum, to beat a tune with the fingers, to play a stringed instrument, to make music, sing to stringed instruments

PARAS

To break apart, disperse, break, chop in pieces, lay open, scatter, spread (abroad, forth, selves, out), stretch (forth, out)

Psalms 143:6 I spread out my hands to you; my soul longs for you like a thirsty land. Selah

PATSACH

To break out (in joyful sound), break forth into joy, make a loud noise

Psalms 98:4 Shout joyfully to the Lord, all the earth; break forth in song, rejoice, and sing praises.

RAGAD

To stamp, to spring about (wildly or for joy), aloud, noise, shouted

1 Chronicles 15:29 And it happened, as the ark of the covenant of the Lord came to the City of David, that Michal, Saul's daughter, looked through a window and saw King David whirling and playing music; and she despised him in her heart.

A shout (for joy), joyful voice, singing, triumphing

A shrill sound, shout of grief or joy, gladness, proclamation, rejoicing, shouting, triumph, singing

Psalms 107:22 Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare his works with rejoicing.

Psalms 118:15 The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the tents of the righteous; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly (in NIV it says "...does mighty things").

Psalms 126:6 He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.

ROWMAM

Exaltation, praise, be extolled

Psalms 66:17 I cried to him with my mouth, and he was extolled with my tongue.

RUWA

To split the ears with sound, shout (for alarm or joy), blow an alarm, make a joyful noise, shout for joy, sound an alarm

Joshua 6:20 So the people shouted when the priests blew the trumpets. And it happened when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat. Then the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

Psalms 47:1 Oh, clap your hands, all you peoples! Shout to God with the voice of triumph!

Psalms 65:13 The pastures are clothed with flocks; the valleys also are covered with grain; they shout for joy, they also sing.

SAMACH

To brighten up, cheer up, make glad, make merry

Psalms 31:7 I will be glad and rejoice in your mercy, for you have considered my trouble; you have known my soul in adversities.

Blithe or gleeful, glad, joyful, making merry, hearted, rejoice

Cheerfulness, welcome, gladness, joy, rejoicing, mirth

Psalms 119:111 Your testimonies I have taken as a heritage forever, for they are the rejoicing of my heart.

SHABACH

To address in a loud tone, a loud adoration, a shout, proclaiming with a loud voice (unashamed), to glory, triumph, power, a testimony of praise

Psalms 63:3 Because your lovingkindness is better than life, my lips shall praise you.

Psalms 106:47 Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the Gentiles, to give thanks to your holy name, to triumph in your praise.

Psalms 145:4 One generation shall praise your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.

SHAOWN

Uproar (as a rushing), destruction, noise, pomp, rushing, tumult

Psalms 66:1 Make a joyful shout to God, all the earth!

Psalms 81:1 Sing aloud to God our strength; make a joyful shout to the God of Jacob.

SHEBACH

Adore, praise, to adulate

Daniel 2:23 I thank you and praise you, O God of my fathers; You have given me wisdom and might, and have now made known to me what we asked of you, for you have made known to us the king's demand.

Daniel 4:34 And at the end of the time I, Nebuchadnezzar, lifted my eyes to heaven, and my understanding returned to me; and I blessed the Most High and praised and honored him who lives forever: For his dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom is from generation to generation.

SHIRYAH

A song, singing, musical song

Psalms 96:1 Oh, sing to the Lord a new song! Sing to the Lord, all the earth.

Psalms 98:1 Oh, sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things; his right hand and his holy arm have gained him the victory.

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SUWS

To be bright, cheerful, be glad, make mirth, rejoice

Psalms 35:9 And my soul shall be joyful in the Lord; It shall rejoice in his salvation.

Psalms 40:16 Let all those who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; may those who love your salvation say continually, "The Lord be magnified!"

Psalms 119:162 I rejoice at your word as one who finds great treasure.

TAGA

To clatter, slap hands together, clang an instrument, to become bondsman by hand clasping, blow a trumpet

Psalms 47:1 Oh, clap your hands, all you peoples! Shout to God with the voice of triumph!

TERUWAH

An acclamation of joy or a battle cry, clangor of trumpets, sounding of an alarm

Psalms 27:6 And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me; therefore I will offer sacrifices of joy in his tabernacle; I will sing, yes, I will sing praises to the Lord.

ZAMMAR

An instrumental musician, singer

Ezra 7:24 Also we inform you that it shall not be lawful to impose tax, tribute, or custom on any of the priests, Levites, singers, gatekeepers, Nethinim, or servants of this house of God.

ZEMAR

Instrumental music

Daniel 3:7 So at that time, when all the people heard the sound of the horn, flute, harp, and lyre, in symphony with all kinds of music, all the people, nations, and languages fell down and worshiped the gold image which King Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

A musical piece, song to be accompanied by an instrument, melody, psalm


Psalms 81:2 Raise a song and strike the timbral, the pleasant harp with the lute.
