The Challenges of University Student Ministry Today

There is no doubt that university students are one of the most strategic groups. Christian student movements have made a huge difference for the Kingdom in Europe and globally, but it has become extremely difficult in most countries of Europe to communicate the gospel on university campuses. What are the greatest challenges and how should we respond to them? What are timeless principles that come directly from our Lord and his disciples and should not be changed, and what strategies and methods should change? How do we do evangelism if "big meetings" have stopped working? What we do with the fruit of evangelism, and how do we "make disciples"? What does it take to develop a leader who can bring a Kingdom difference to society?

II. Starting and building a spiritual movement

- A. Seeing the big picture Josef
 - 1. Not only the eternal difference for the individual, but a better future for the nation / country (Mt 28:18 20; Acts 1:8)
 - 2. Not only multiplication of individual disciples of Jesus, but also multiplication of campus ministries
 - a. There is no multiplication without dying to self
 - b. Do not get discouraged if it is difficult and slow it is God' business, not ours
 - c. Stay faithful to biblical principles
 - 3. Defining our part in God's plan with the country / nation;
 - a. Vision and core values
 - b. Setting BOUNDARIES of who we are, what we do, and what we are not and do not do:
 - In Theology
 - In Strategy
 - In Partnerships (who we work with)
 - In our way of communication
 - We cannot please everyone, so let us seek to please the One
 - 4. We need to be concerned about what happens to and through our students AFTER they leave the student ministry, the overall impact of their life
 - 5. It is not about the "know-how" and "how-to" (strategies, programs, materials, structures etc.) It is about the people, love, sacrifice, attitudes and first and foremost, about God and His Glory.
