1 KINGS 17-18



SPOKE WITH PROPHETIC POWER AND AUTHORITY

1 KINGS 17:1

... said to Ahab, "As the Lord God of Israel lives, in whose presence I stand, there will be no dew or rain during these years except by my command!"



EXPERIENCED CONSISTENT MIRACULOUS PROVISION

1 KINGS 17:4b, 6

"...I have commanded the ravens to provide for you there."...⁶ The ravens kept bringing him bread and meat in the morning and in the evening, and he would drink from the wadi.



1 KINGS 17:16

The flour jar did not become empty, and the oil jug did not run dry, according to the word of the LORD he had spoken through Elijah.



RAISED THE DEAD TO LIFE

1 KINGS 17:21-22

Then he stretched himself out over the boy three times. He cried out to the LORD and said, "LORD my God, please let this boy's life come into him again!" ²² So the LORD listened to Elijah, and the boy's life came into him again, and he lived.



SPIRIT FILLED COURAGE, CONFRONTATION & VICTORY

1 KINGS 18:18-19

¹⁸ He replied, "I have not ruined Israel, but you and your father's family have, because you have abandoned the LORD's commands and followed the Baals. ¹⁹ Now summon all Israel to meet me at Mount Carmel, along with the 450 prophets of Baal and the 400 prophets of Asherah who eat at Jezebel's table."



CALLS DOWN FIRE FROM HEAVEN

1 KINGS 18:37-40

³⁷ Answer me, LORD! Answer me so that this people will know that you, the LORD, are God and that you have turned their hearts back."

Then the LORD's fire fell and consumed the burnt offering, the wood, the stones, and the dust, and it licked up the water that was in the trench.

CALLS DOWN FIRE FROM HEAVEN

³⁹ When all the people saw it, they fell facedown and said, "The LORD, he is God! The LORD, he is God!"

⁴⁰ Then Elijah ordered them, "Seize the prophets of Baal! Do not let even one of them escape." So they seized them, and Elijah brought them down to the Wadi Kishon and slaughtered them there.

CALLS DOWN RAIN FROM HEAVEN

1 KINGS 18:41, 45a

⁴¹ Elijah said to Ahab, "Go up, eat and drink, for there is the sound of a rainstorm." . . . ⁴⁵ In a little while, the sky grew dark with clouds and wind, and there was a downpour . . .



GOD ANSWERS HIS PRAYERS OVER & OVER & OVER

JAMES 5:17-18

¹⁷ Elijah <u>was a human being as we are,</u> and <u>he</u> <u>prayed earnestly</u> that it would not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the land. ¹⁸ Then <u>he prayed again</u>, and the sky gave rain and the land produced its fruit.



SUPERNATURAL ABILITY TO RUN & RUN & RUN

1 KINGS 18:46

The power of the LORD was on Elijah, and he tucked his mantle under his belt and ran ahead of Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel.

1 KINGS 19:1-2

Ahab told Jezebel everything that Elijah had done and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. ² So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, "May the gods punish me and do so severely if I don't make your life like the life of one of them by this time tomorrow!"



1 KINGS 18:3b-4, 13

... Obadiah was a man who greatly feared the LORD 4 and took a hundred prophets and hid them, fifty men to a cave, and provided them with food and water when Jezebel slaughtered the LORD's prophets. . . . 13 "Wasn't it reported to my lord what I did when Jezebel slaughtered the LORD's prophets? I hid a hundred of the prophets of the LORD, fifty men to a cave, and I provided them with food and water."

VALLEY OF **FEAR**

1 KINGS 19:3-4

³ Then <u>Elijah became afraid</u> and immediately <u>ran</u> for his life. When he came to Beer-sheba that belonged to Judah, he <u>left</u> his servant there,

⁴ but he <u>went</u> on a day's journey into the wilderness. He <u>sat down</u> under a broom tree and <u>prayed that he might die</u>. He said, "I have had enough! LORD, take my life, for I'm no better than my ancestors."



2 TIMOTHY 1:7

For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but one of power, love, and sound judgment.

1 KINGS 18:22

1 KINGS 19:4c

. . . and prayed that he might die. He said, "I have had enough! LORD, take my life, for I'm no better than my ancestors."

11 Then he said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the LORD's presence." At that moment, the LORD passed by. A great and mighty wind was tearing at the mountains and was shattering cliffs before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake.

Suddenly, a voice came to him and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?"

¹⁷ Then Jehu will put to death whoever escapes the sword of Hazael, and Elisha will put to death whoever escapes the sword of Jehu. ¹⁸ But I will leave seven thousand in Israel—every knee that has not bowed to Baal and every mouth that has not kissed him."
