Leadership and Sexual Integrity

It is a tragic reality that many Christian leaders fall into sexual immorality, with the result that their ministry has to come to an end and the cause of the gospel is dishonoured. This talk will examine the particular challenges to sexual integrity that are encountered in Christian leadership. Why do pastoral leadership and the service of the Lord so often seem to be a context for strong sexual temptations? How does sexual temptation manifest itself at different life-stages of the Christian leader? Only if we appreciate these dangers will we be able to guard against them.

John Stevens is the National Director of the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches, a family of over 500 Bible-centred churches in the UK, a position that he has held since 2010. Prior to this he was one of the founding pastors of City Evangelical Church Birmingham, which was planted in the centre of the UK's 2nd largest city in 1999. He was instrumental in starting the Midlands Gospel Partnership, was the course Director of the Midlands Ministry Training Course and is a visiting lecturer at Oak Hill Theological College. John is also one of the pastors of Christchurch Market Harborough, a church he helped to plant when he took up his current role. He was converted whilst studying law at Cambridge University, and after taking a post-graduate degree at the University of Oxford worked for 16 years as a University Lecturer, ending his career as Deputy Head of the Law School at the University of Birmingham.
