Understanding Present Day Culture and the Implications for Church Revitalisation

One of key reasons why there is an urgent need for church revitalisation is Europe is because it is a post-Christian secular context. In some Protestant European countries the evangelical church has been declining for over 150 years, whereas in others with a Catholic of Orthodox heritage there has never been a strong evangelical church. It is therefore vital that we understand the context in which we are seeking to ministry the gospel and renew the church as this will determine both the opportunities and challenges we face. Drawing on biblical teaching and examples from contemporary European contexts we will consider the impact of contemporary culture, both positively and negatively, on church revitalisation.

John Stevens is the National Director of the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches, a family of over 500 Bible-centred churches in the UK, a position that he has held since 2010. Prior to this, he was one of the founding pastors of City Evangelical Church Birmingham, which was planted in the centre of the UK's 2nd largest city in 1999.
