- B. What is the heart?



1. The heart is organised around desire, treasures, affections

- a. Natural desires this is typically your entrance into a person's life
 O LORD, you hear the desire of the afflicted. (Psalm 10:17)
- b. Moral desires this is where you identify the path of wisdom and flourishing. *The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.* (Luke 6:45)
- c. Godward desire this is the very depths of the heart. It is where we want to know the Lord accurately and respond to him with faithful love.
 Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire besides you. (Psalm 73:25)
- 2. Growth and change comes out of a simple process: know the person, know Jesus
